DrumStix Market on Shermer to Feature Comfort Food

Northbrook's newest downtown restaurant at 1363 Shermer will feature casual and affordable signature dishes developed over the years by owner and renown Chicago chef Steve Chiappetti. Steve and wife Leslie, Northbrook residents, are working hard on the finishing touches preparing for the restaurant to open this month.

Both bring their long history of restaurant ownership and management to their new farm to table venture. DrumStix Market will feature chicken, meat and side dishes created by Steve that can be enjoyed right at the restaurant, or carried out. Chiappetti has spent 20 years perfecting many of the recipes, particularly his chicken dishes at other restaurants throughout the Chicago area.



The restaurant name reflects not only the poultry theme, but their son's interest in the other kind of drumsticks - musical. Music, particularly Chicago blues, will be an important part of the restaurant ambiance, notes Leslie.

The style will be casual, in a homey, comfortable atmosphere, according to the couple. In addition to the dinner menu, they hope to eventually serve lunch during the week, breakfast on the weekends and also offer catering. The restaurant hours will start off as 4:00 p.m. - 9:00 p.m. Tuesday through Thursday, 4:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. on Friday and Saturday and 2:00 p.m. - 9:00 p.m. on Sunday.

With Auction items coming in every day, and fabulous restaurants signed up for the Taste, the event is sure to be another big hit. If you've attended in the past you know what a terrific event it is, so please help us spread the word. Potash Merger with Fertilizer Producer Agrium Announced

Fertilizer giant PotashCorp, with a major office in Northbrook, recently announced a merger with Agrium Inc. According to official statements, both companies, which are Canadian based, "agreed to combine in a merger of equals to create a world-class integrated global supplier of crop inputs." Under the terms of the agreement, a new parent company will own both companies with leadership split equally, including top management and equal board representation. After the merger is complete, Potash shareholders will own 52% of the new company, while Agrium's investors will own 48 percent.

Potash and Agrium are two of the world's largest producers of crop fertilizers, producing nitrogen, potassium compounds known as

potash and phosphate fertilizers that farmers use to raise healthy crops. The merger is expected to enable both companies to cut combined costs annually over the next few years to help them with the changing market dynamics.

The new company will have close to 20,000 employees, with operations and investments in 18 countries. The merger is expected to be completed in mid 2017. There will be an integration process for both companies pursued after that. The Northbrook office, which currently employs 158 people, will continue to serve as a U.S. commercial center for the company. The merger will require regulatory and competition reviews in both Canada and the United States.

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November Election Voting Options

While the media is focused heavily on the Presidential election, it's important to remember that a number of other important state and local races will be also decided at the polls next month. In addition to the top of the ticket, voters will also decide the winner of the 9th and 10th Congressional District, Illinois Senate seat, State Comptroller, several Illinois State Senate seats, State's Attorney, Clerk of the Circuit Court, all Illinois House seats, and numerous judges.

This month there are some important deadlines and dates to remember for anyone planning to cast their vote. Tuesday, Oct. 11 is the last day to register to vote. Voters can register online at ova.elections.il.gov or through www.cookcountyclerk.com, or at Village Hall during normal business hours.

Voters who don't want to wait until the November 8 Election Day, can cast their ballot early, starting Monday, October 24 through November 7. Voters do not need to provide an excuse or reason why they cannot make it to the polls on Election Day. Early voters must provide proof of their identification. Valid forms of ID include a current driver's license or state-issued ID

card, or any government-issued ID with a photo.

Early voting at Northbrook Village Hall will take place:

9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. on Monday, October 24; Saturday, October 29; Saturday, November 5 and Monday, November 7

9:00 - 3:00 p.m. on Sunday, October 30 and Sunday November 6.

Any registered suburban Cook County voter can also request a mail ballot using an online application at mailvoting.cookcountyclerk.com

The ballot must be requested by November 3 and then can be mailed in.

On Election Day, Tuesday, November 8, all polls are open from 6:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m. To see a sample of your ballot, or find your polling place visit www.cookcountyclerk.com, type in your name and address on the form and follow the prompts.



Northbrook Caucus Gearing Up for 2017 Election

In advance of the 2017 election, the Northbrook Caucus, a citizens' screening committee, is in the process of vetting candidates for Caucus endorsement for positions on the Northbrook Village, Northbrook Park District, Northbrook Library and Northbrook School District 28 Boards. Following interviews with candidates who have submitted applications, the Caucus will meet on Sunday, October 23, at Greenbriar School to consider all the applicants and recommend nominees for the various boards. The Caucus will officially select its slate of candidates at a Town Meeting on Sunday, November 13 at Wood Oaks School, which is open to all residents. Caucus screeners must be registered voters and reside within the Village boundaries or within the school district boundaries. six years ago and were excited to find the available space for their newest venture right in their own backyard. "We are thrilled to live and work in Northbrook," states Leslie, who said they decided against another North Shore location in favor of the space on Shermer Road. "We love Northbrook's diversity, open spaces and everything about the community."

DrumStix will include four to six unique dishes under each heading: Meat (chicken and ribs), Grabbers (burger and brisket), Farmer's Market, (vegetables with a variety of dressings and chicken salad), Veggie Market (variety of root vegetables, coleslaw) Pan Cooking (roast beef, cheesy, pork and veggie mac) Potatoes (chicken fat gravy fries OMG) and My Sugar (3 desserts) Most items are under \$10.

Currently Steve is chef and consultant for Elawa Farm, a restored gentleman's farm and garden in Lake Forest. A Chicago native, Steve Chiappetti comes from five

generations of butchers on each side of his family. His family name is behind Chicago's oldest slaughter and packinghouse, Chiappetti Lamb and Veal, which after 51 years of business is the last remaining slaughterhouse in the Chicago Stockyards. "It's a dream to bring in the Chiappetti meats to a family-owned restaurant," notes Leslie. Steve's Mom is also a gourmet chef and will play a role in running the restaurant.

Steve forged his own unique style of cooking with a mixture of formal training (Culinary School at Kendall College) and hands-on experience, including stints at the Ritz-Carlton, Spiaggia and the prestigious Cunard Liner. Part of his training was in France competing for the Bocuse D'Or representing the USA in the highest culinary competition in the world.

As a chef and entrepreneur, Chiappetti went on to blaze his own trail, opening a string of successful, highly acclaimed restaurants including Grapes, a three-star Mediterranean cafe and funky neighborhood

place with a colorful dining room. He later joined forces with the Chicago Symphony to open Rhapsody, a three-star contemporary American bistro, then consulted on the Freehling Room, the private donor's club at Ravinia Festival. He is also a "Today Show" regular and Disney Food Wine Festival chef.

Free Marketing & Communication Tools For Chamber Members

Members looking to share news with fellow Chamber members as well as business and community leaders have a valuable partner with the Chamber, with a wide array of options ranging from print to web to social media at their disposal. While there are different guidelines and deadlines for each, all of the following communication tools are available to members at no charge.

Newsletter

The Chamber's 8-page monthly newsletter features 14 – 15 news items about Chamber members on the Business Briefs page, offering a convenient way to announce an event or program, fundraiser, new product, store opening, a new website, an award or special recognition. News items must be submitted by the 10th of the month and should be no more than 50 words. The newsletter is circulated to roughly 1,000 Chamber members and civic leaders and

is published on the Chamber website for further reach.

E-Announcements

Another popular way to share news is through the Chamber's monthly e-blast, which is sent to over 1900 Chamber e-mail contacts the first business day of each month. Appropriate information for e-Announcements follows the same guidelines as the newsletter, but can be particularly helpful when promoting events, classes or programs as a registration or website link can be included. Videos posted to YouTube and links to news articles about Chamber members are also often featured in the e-blast. News items must be submitted to info@northbrookchamber.org by the 25th of the prior month, and are accepted on a first come, first served basis. Due to space limitations, announcements are limited to 40 words.

Members Only Page

Members can easily promote an event or fundraiser on the Member's Only portal, accessible through the Chamber's website northbrookchamber.org. Any employee of a member business is eligible to have his or her own login credentials. This will allow access to the Members Only page where they can post an event for that business with pictures or graphics along with other relevant information of any length. It is important to note that the Members Only calendar is private and only visible to other Chamber members.

Facebook

The Chamber Facebook page is an increasingly popular way to publicize last minute events and late breaking news from members. The page features colorful photos of Chamber events and is dedicated

By now all members should have been contacted via e-mail or fax to complete and return the Chamber's "Membership Verification" form. Updates provided to the Chamber during this annual outreach process are vital to ensure accurate information appears on the Chamber website, and that the correct contact information is given out when making referrals. If your business has moved, has a new phone number or a new website address, if you have employees you would like to delete or add to the database to receive Chamber news, this a great opportunity to update your Chamber records. Even if there are no changes, please e-mail or respond to the Chamber to confirm that you have reviewed your listing.

In addition to verifying contact information, members are reminded to take full advantage of the ability to use up to 600 characters (around 50 words) to describe their business. This offers an opportunity to explain more about a business specialty and for members to differentiate themselves from their competitors. In addition to an accurate and up-to-date business description, members should also make sure they list keywords, which will improve search results both on the Chamber's website and with major search engines such as Google, Yahoo and Bing.

Be sure to check the accuracy of your physical address which will appear on the Chamber website and in publications. You can also list a different mailing address where you would like to receive the newsletter or other mailings from the Chamber. Remember to list the correct address for anyone receiving the newsletter. It is also very valuable for the Chamber to have correct e-mail addresses for all members, as it is a convenient means of communicating important information. Please note that e-mails provided to the Chamber are not sold, given out, or included in any publication.

A great way to check the effectiveness of your listing is to log onto the Chamber website www.northbrookchamber.org and search for your business name. Does your business come up in the right category? Could you benefit by being listed in a second or third category? Could your listing be more prominent with a hot deal or banner ad? These and other low cost options can set your business apart from the others and ensure that your business comes up in a search. If you did not receive the verification form, or if you have any questions about how to update your records, or are interested in additional marketing tools, please contact the Chamber at (847)498-5555 and any staff member will be happy to help you out.
