## Jar Bar Brings New Dining Concept to Downtown

Fresh, thoughtful, healthy and tasteful, nostalgic, made with love -- these words are not generally associated with quick, fast food. Northbrook resident and Jar Bar owner Karen Firsel, says these words are perfect descriptions of her restaurant, its food and its vibe, set to open in downtown Northbrook at the corner of Meadow and Shermer this month.

"I created Jar Bar to open up new options, disrupt what we know from our fast-casual food choices here and give people a glimpse of what is possible for breakfast, lunch and dinner," she says. Karen is putting her heart and soul and literally her family recipes behind the restaurant which



she believes will be the first of its kind in the northern Chicago area. "I saw a huge void in the fast casual restaurant space," she comments. Hoping to get people to look at healthy differently she comments "Healthy is being redefined as eating real and natural ingredients with deep flavors. It isn't about non-fat, low-fat or low carb. You deserve to have great flavors combined in a great dining experience."

Karen grew up in a home with delicious meals prepared by her mother, "where food equaled love." She hopes to bring that same warmth and hospitality to her new restaurant. "Everything we serve will be meaningful," she comments, noting all items are created by her and inspired by the people around her. Some of the items are family favorites including her Dad's favorite banana bread, her Mom's chicken soup,

## Annual Economic Outlook Breakfast "What To Expect Under President Trump"

BMO Private Bank US Chief Investment Officer Jack Ablin will be the keynote speaker at the Chamber's annual Economic Outlook breakfast, held in partnership with the Deerfield Bannockburn Riverwoods (DBR) and Glenview Chambers.

Ablin will comment on the recent Trump Administration promises to change the way Washington works, from repealing and replacing the Affordable Care Act (Obamacare), to tax cuts, regulatory rollbacks and fiscal spending. Ablin estimates that all told, the cost of the Commander in Chief's programs will cost more than \$10 trillion over the next ten years. "While the prospective legislation is clearly stimulative, we will examine what's likely to pass and what impact it will have on the economy and stock markets, both domestically

## Trends and Demographics to Drive Changes to Northbrook Court

Changing demographics, new shopping patterns including the way different generations approach the shopping experience, and the demand for new types of stores are providing challenges for the owners of Northbrook Court. Already talks have begun with Village officials about how to address the future development of the mall, the largest retail shopping center in the Village and a renown North

Shore shopping destination. At a recent joint meeting with the Village's economic advisory panels, the Industrial Commercial Development Commission (ICDC) and Economic Development Committee (EDC), two development officials from GGP, which owns Northbrook Court, shared their research about changing shopping patterns and trends. Adam Tritt, GGP VP of Development, and Ben Freeman,

Senior Director of Development, explained that the process has already begun to re-evaluate some of the tenant spaces in the center, particularly with underperforming anchor stores and over 10% of leases up for renewal this year. They emphasized that they see new opportunities and are optimistic about the future of the center, which is an important part of their high quality portfolio.

"The old model of the mall of the '70s and '80s (very formulaic) is giving way to more free flowing experiential form of real estate," stated Tritt. "Whereas once malls from the early 2000s were built, they didn't change their form, now with changes in shopping demands, the form also needs to change." They noted that malls with fashion-based anchors worked for a long time. "Now you're seeing what drives people out of the house -- out of the office at lunch time -- is more diverse," commented Tritt. "We are seeing a higher demand for restaurants, interest in grocery stores, entertainment, movies, as well as service businesses."

Despite talk in the marketplace about the massive growth in on-line retail sales, they cited statistics that showed that the Internet actually drives shoppers to brick and mortar stores. According to their research, 93% of all retail sales can be entirely or partially attributed to brick and mortar stores and 91% of all retail sales are conducted in a brick and mortar store. "The only thing the Internet killed was catalogue sales," they pointed out. Using Apple as an example, they noted that many retailers have figured out the relationship between the efficient purchase of goods and the experience at their stores. "Retailers themselves realize that existing only on the Internet will only get them so far," commented Tritt. "They, too, have to exist in both spaces." Brick and mortar stores which offer the opportunity for returns and pick-ups of Internet purchases often generate additional sales they pointed out.

Looking at millennials (ages 25 - 34), who have the highest propensity to shop, research shows the demand for experiences is significantly higher than other generations. However, many of the uses they seek (entertainment, big box, grocery, hotels) are prohibited by



Northbrook's Zoning Code, which presents GGP's biggest challenge. Other challenges include the center's location. Unlike other malls which have 360-degree access, Northbrook Court drives all of its traffic off a single street -- Lake Cook Road.

Village President Sandy Frum commented at the meeting that the Village has already begun conversations with GGP regarding Northbrook Court. However, she pointed out that Northbrook has a culture of control. "Our codes are relatively restrictive," she commented. "We're really good at reacting when someone asks us to change something, but often are not good at giving someone the leeway to negotiate a new idea. We need to figure out how to work together so GGP has an opportunity to make changes," she added.

Freeman and Tritt encouraged the Village to be open to new and different uses in the mall and to be flexible with zoning and development regulations to give them the freedom to respond to the changing retail environment. "The status quo has the potential to be disruptive," commented Tritt. "If we do nothing then we risk catastrophic loss."

The two indicated that GGP has already redeveloped 91 of their 95 vacant anchor department stores, which has been tremendously successful. In addition, they both see changing energy and dynamics in a market that was previously static, offering new opportunities. "Retail is alive and changing," commented Tritt. "That's really the story we believe in and know to be true going forward."

her daughter's favorite turkey and humus sandwich and a twist on her son's peanut butter and jelly. Some of the items are an elevated take on classic dishes such as the hot oatmeal dish "Cake for Breakfast" with swirls of cashew cream in hot oatmeal with granola and coconut sugars.

The food will be packaged in portable 8 to 24 ounce plastic jars that can be re-used for other purposes. "Our salads will go beyond focusing on lettuce," she comments, "and we will serve them in our signature jar with dressings on the bottom." The restaurant will feature artisanal oat bars, poached eggs with vegetables, pastries made with fruit purees, soups, rotating side salads, sandwiches and daily seasonal specials. Nitro coffees and cold brews will also be served.

Aware of diners seeking value related to portion size, the menu items will be competitively priced with salads in the \$10 - \$15 range and breakfast items in the \$5 - \$6 range. There will be plenty of cold items that can be tossed in a work bag for lunch.

Karen attributes her concept for the restaurant to her love of food, her TV background (as a producer of the Oprah show) and her role as an influencer and identifier of trends. Jar Bar is located across from Village Green Park and within walking distance to the train station. Karen and her husband, real estate developer Adam Firsell, found the spot to be ideal because of its accessibility.

Initially the restaurant will feature breakfast and lunch items every day with the possibility of dinner hours in the summer. For more information visit [www.jarbar.com](http://www.jarbar.com).

Ablin will also share his insight on basic economic indicators, including the expected rise in interest rates, inflation, the housing market and the outlook for employment. He will discuss whether bubbles are forming domestically in specific markets, including real estate.

As head of Macro Strategy, Ablin chairs the Asset Allocation, Mutual Fund Re-Optimization and Harriscreen Stock Selection committees and is responsible for establishing investment policy and strategy within BMO Private Bank throughout the U.S. He joined the organization in 2001 and has three decades of experience in money management.

Ablin is an author on a variety of topics, including investor psychology and financial markets outlook. He is also a frequent contributor to the national news outlets on economic policy, including CNBC, Bloomberg, The Wall Street Journal and Barron's. He spent five years as a Money and Markets correspondent for the NBC affiliate in Jacksonville, Florida. He also served as a Professor of Finance at Boston University, Graduate School of Management.
